Disposition:

- a) A precise question to be further investigated. This question could be formulated within your own plans for further studies –for instance a part of a master thesis or another project you are already involved in or planning/wanting to get involved in. Linking questions, approaches and methods within different disciplines is a merit.
- b) Argue for the importance of your question from at least two perspectives: its scientific relevance and its relevance for a welfare and health perspective.
- c) Present a framework for the question, making the connection between specific question and its wider social context. Refer to theoretical works and empirical evidence (join a bibliographical list of ten important references), suggesting a "model" indicating that such links exist. You should make a convincing case for the reader implying that there is a good reason to carry out further investigations in order to test hypothesises or further deepen the knowledge.
- d) Refer to types of data which would be valid for information and further understanding. Indicate theories and/or hypothesises that can be tested by these data and the methods to be used (content analysis of texts, statistical analysis, questionnaire/survey, open interviews, 'anthropological' community studies, etc..)..
